JUDGING:

- Judging will begin on Saturday, August 10, 2024, at 6:00 pm in the McAlister Room
- > Juniors will be judged 1st followed by children, then the adults.
- ➤ Appearance 100%
 - Suitability of style to color to model 25%
 - Suitability of fabric to style 25%
 - Fit 25%
 - Eye Appeal 25%
 - If accessories are worn, their suitability will be given consideration.
 - If a blouse is needed to complete the outfit, it is NOT an accessory.
 - Contestant's modeling ability WILL NOT BE JUDGED.
 - Workmanship will be considered in case of a tie.

RULES FOR ADULTS: 18 years and older

- 1. You may choose a model other than yourself.
- 2. If you make two (1) garments, you must model one (1) yourself, but may choose a model for the second garment.

RULES FOR JUNIORS: 13 – 17 years old

1. Garments must be made and modeled by the contestant.

RULES FOR PRE-JUNIORS: 7 – 12 years old

1. Garments must be made and modeled by the contestant.

CATEGORIES

- Adult Elegance includes long or short formal dress, dressy suit, dress with jacket, coat or cape, dressy pantsuit, or party dress.
- Adult Casual includes simple cotton dress, western wear, sports ensemble, tennis dress, jogging suit, short set, casual pantsuit or gown/pj's.
- ➤ Junior Elegance includes long or short formal dress, dressy suit, dress with jacket, coat or cape, dressy pantsuit, or party dress.
- Junior Casual includes simple cotton dress, western wear, sports ensemble, tennis dress, jogging suit, short set, casual pantsuit or gown/pj's.
- \triangleright Activity Time: 7 11 years old made by someone other than the model.
- \triangleright Sugar Plum: 3 6 years old made by someone other than the model.

The object of this class is two-fold - A fashion parade of imaginatively attired individuals in wool garments and well behaved, haltered led sheep judged as a pair with point being given in both sheep and the individual.

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JUDGING Will be Saturday August 10, 2024 at 6:00 pm in the McAlister Room

- 1. Contestant and Garment: 40%
 - a. Major articles of clothing must be made of at least 70% wool
 - b. Boosters' garments may be made of at least 50% wool
 - c. Non-wool accessories are permissible
 - d. Ready-to-Wear woolen garments are not permissible
 - e. Clothing construction will not be judged
 - f. Style of garment, fit and overall appearance will be considered
 - g. This includes grooming, personality and poise of the contestants
- 2. Overall Qualities of Contestant: 20%
 - a. Personality judging and appearance of garment will take place at a designated time and place

SHEEP JUDGING

- 1. Conformation and Quality: 20%
 - a. The ewe should excel in the following characteristics
 - Breed
 - Character
 - Natural Muscling
 - Substance of Bone
 - Structural Soundness of Feet, legs and Mouth
 - Wool Quality Representative of Breed

- 2. Eye Appeal: 10%
 - a. The ewe should be attractively fitted and groomed but not colored or in any way artificially prepared for the show ring. The following criteria should be considered.
 - > The ewe should be clean
 - > The ewe should be smoothly blocked
 - > The ewe should be in good condition
 - Not overly fat or thin
 - > The ewe should be alert
 - The ewe should be stylish and well balanced
- 3. Showmanship at Halter: 10%
 - a. The ewe should respond calmly to the halter in an alert and proud manner. Ease and calmness of handling the sheep will contribute significantly to good showmanship.
- 4. All entrants must be residents of Roosevelt County. Previous state winners are not eligible.
